

We want to thank Pastor Nunes for his tireless work and encouragement regarding his "Strategic Planning" priorities for Pilgrim. We have been making a lot of progress on his suggestions and ideas for Pilgrim. We are scheduling volunteer opportunities again, to help greet people as they come into the Sanctuary, to help with Altar Guild setting up Holy Communion, and doing Fellowship serving coffee and cookies or light refreshments. We will also begin using ushers during the worship services. We discontinued these volunteer opportunities during the Covid Pandemic, due to the government lockdown. Sign up sheets are available in the Narthex.

Pilgrim's connecting to the public with social media: large screens etc.

The one good thing the Covid lockdown did for Pilgrim, was to immediately encourage us to develop a manner in which to connect with our members and those outside our geographic location. Within a few weeks, Mat M. and Allen G. began filming our worship services with an iPhone and posting them on Facebook and our website. We then became more sophisticated and purchased a professional camera, and Mat began developing a filming technique where he could do live filming and perform music at the same time. We are now planning to install two large TV screens inside our sanctuary, to further enhance our in-person and online capabilities. Scripture and music lyrics will be shown on the screens, therefore eliminating the need to "look down" to read the Scriptures from our bulletins, hymn books and Bibles. We will continue to print and hand out our Sunday bulletins, to take home for reference, etc. We also have plans to update our website, to enhance the ability to connect with our members and the public. We will keep you updated on these plans. A professional graphic artist created a "Pilgrim Logo" to give Pilgrim's publicity a new look. (See Pastor Nunes' essay on this.) "News from Pastor Nunes" NEW LOGO, NEW PRIORITIES

One of my mentors in life and ministry once put it like this: "**The renewal of evangelism requires a passion and preparedness to go out in the name of Jesus in order to encounter people in their maddening diversities, with profound respect for the questions they are carrying on the way to their Lord.**" (Richard John Neuhaus, 1985.) What does this quote have to do with our new logo and our six new strategic priorities? My deep prayer for us is that these will spark renewal at Pilgrim Lutheran Church. More than a beautiful design, more than words on a page, but action.

<u>Evangelism</u> is the kind of action we need: speaking and living the saving news of God in Jesus Christ—letting our good words and good works be heard and seen by family members, friends, coworkers, and neighbors. And, by doing so "with profound respect" for them so that they are drawn to our God, as our mission statement says, "to flourish in the love of Jesus Christ."

Yes, Los Angeles can be a maddeningly diverse community—so many different kinds of humans. Further, the majority of people who live in Pilgrim's neighborhood are unchurched. Is this not a prime opportunity for evangelism!

This logo captures this, a harmonious circle of life amid diversity. Many different parts functioning together as a unified whole. It's based on our rose window, on the west end of the church, above the entrance doors. We are made one by the Holy Spirit working through Word and Sacraments.

At the center of our logo stands what is at the center of everything we do and everything we are as a congregation: **the cross of Jesus Christ**. Trace the many open pathways for people on their pilgrimage to Christ, representing "the questions they are carrying on the way to their Lord."

Finally, note the colors of our liturgical year.

blue/violet: Advent, Lent, seasons of hope and repentance

red: Pentecost, martyrs, Reformation, symbolizing fire and commemoration

white/gold: Christmas, Easter, saints' days, symbolizing joy

green: ordinary time, Sundays after Pentecost, season of growth
